Light a candle and make sure it is safe and don't leave unattended.

The Holy Spirit

We believe in a Triune God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Our Mass begins and ends with us professing our faith in the Trinity by making the sign of the cross.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Other liturgies do the same. The Holy Spirit is vital in our day to day life. He/she is mentioned quite a few times in our scriptures. In Luke's infancy narratives at the beginning of his gospel we hear the angel saying to Mary that Spirit will come down upon her. At the beginning of the Acts of the Apostles we read that they are waiting for the coming of the Spirit. Our Lord would tolerate everything apart from one thing and that was anybody going against the Spirit, abusing or denying the Spirit. For them it would be eternal damnation.

The Holy Spirit continues to guide us today and every day. Not just the Pope and the clergy but every person who will listen. The Holy Spirit gives us seven gifts and twelve fruits for our use in our daily lives. It is the Holy Spirit who is invoked at Mass when the priest holds his hands over the gifts just before the consecration (when you hear a single bell rung).

We are baptised in the name of the Trinity and receive the Holy Spirit when we are confirmed.

Come Holy Spirit and fill the hearts of the faithful.

Today we start using the O Antiphons.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen

God our Father, as we get closer to the celebration of your Son's birth all those years ago, we prepare ourselves by going over the events in scripture. Help to see what is familiar to us in a refreshed light. Through our Lord Jesus Christ your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.
